### OCALA ART GROUP PRESIDENT'S STATEMENT SHARON HARRIS, 2021







### SUSAN SILVERMAN FINK

Born in Manhattan, to two artist-parents, Susan Silverman (Fink) has always been surrounded by art. Her father, Elijah Silverman, was a painter, teacher at the School of Visual Arts, a very successful hand letterer & logo designer, and her mother, Ruth L. Silverman, a successful commercial artist. Encouraging their daughter to develop her own burgeoning talents, they saw that she became involved in a group called "All Communities Arts" where in 1971 and '72 she won "Best Drawing" awards. During that same period, Susan also had her work included in an exhibit at the Brooklyn Museum 1973 and in 1972 was accepted in the juried Washington Square

Art Show. A "League family," Susan and her parents had all studied at the Art Students League, further solidifying their artistic ties. In addition to the League, Susan studied at the School of Visual Arts. NYC; the Woodstock School of Art, Joan Slocum PSA, Woodstock, NY; and Barrett House, Poughkeepsie, NY.

### Art Group for Ocala is Project Proposed by University Women

One of the outstanding achievements of the Ocala branch of the American Association of University Women his year was the idea to start an art club in Ocala. Plans for this project are now in progress.

An organizational meeting will take place at the home of Mr. and Mrs. John H. Newberry, 904 E. Fort King on Tuesday evening. Mrs. Owen Swanson will present the slate of officers. Appearing on the slate are president, Mrs. Kathryn Duncan Newberry; ice-president Mrs. Leonard Henninger, secretary, Mrs. James j. Caruso, treasurer, Colonel G. K. Althaus.

Cards are being mailed to the persons who signed up for the club at the University Women's meeting last winter. Persons who exhibited their work in the town will also be present. The club, however, is by no means restricted to these groups. Anyone who likes art or is interested in any phase of it is invited to join. One does not have to be talented in art to belong. The real object is that one likes or enjoys art.

At the organizational meeting the objectives of the club will be worked out. These will probably include working together at times, sharing ideas, selecting a suitable place for existing work.

It is felt that Ocala is not too small to have an art club of its own. The A.A.U.W. does not claim the entire credit for the idea. It is certainly not original. A number of interested citizens have expressed the idea again and again. It was voiced again at the Garden Club art exhibit.

The Ocala Art Club will be an organization of its own. The University Women projected the idea, but will not control it. Everyone is invited to join. Star-Banner May 13, 1951
