

Member SPOTLIGHT Lee Asta



Lee was born and raised in Queens, N.Y. She spent 23 years as a NYC Teacher...the last 16 as a Special Education Middle School Teacher which she not only found very challenging, but also totally loved it!! The idea of retiring at the age of 57 scared her!!! Would she be bored? To prevent this from occurring, she decided to take a Watercolor painting class in her local Library while still on Long Island to learn what to do after you opened a paint tube. The Lighthouse painting she did (along with everyone else's) was displayed for a whole month in the Library Lobby and she loved stopping in to see it often. She couldn't believe that she had painted it!!!

She NEVER thought she was an "ARTIST" and never intended to be one!!! Upon moving to The Villages, she immediately joined a new art group (VAA) just starting up and actually become its President a couple of years later.

Lee dabbled in Watercolor for a while, but it wasn't until almost 60 years old that she took her first WORKSHOP (by Marilyn Roland) in Mixed Media that she totally FLIPPED!!! She loved it!!! She entered her first Art Show and won an HONORABLE MENTION and she was OFF!. The next show she entered, she put in 3 pieces: one in Oil, one in Watercolor and one in Mixed Media. She won 2 Ribbons and sold the LOSER!!!

Although she has won about 50 Ribbons since she started 22 years ago, she still has trouble calling herself an Artist because of her lack of "FORMAL" training. She will still hand in an Entry to a SHOW with her eyes closed saying "Here is my Entry, I don't even know if this is art?" Upon returning later, she will often find a ribbon on that same piece of art!!!

Lee has many entertaining stories about her art, but is most impressed by two achievements both at art shows: First was when she won "BEST O F SHOW" at the OAG Fine Art Show at the Appleton Art Museum for her Watercolor/Ink painting called "Nana's Vase" in 2004. The Second time was the Spring of 2021 at the NOMA Art Gallery when her Mixed Media piece called "Generation X=Y=Z" won Second Place , monetary prize and was donated and sold in an Auction for a Fundraiser there.

Lee loves the creative process of producing her art (mostly Acrylics and/or Mixed Media) .She will tell anyone who listens, she strictly creates for her own enjoyment. She rarely plans what she is going to paint and may start out with one subject which suddenly disappears and evolves quickly into something totally different.

Lee loves the creative process of producing her art, even though she was diagnosed 7 years ago with WET Macular Degenertion. She goes for shots in BOTH eyes every 5 weeks and is still able to drive and paint *(but not at the same time!!!)* She recently has even taken on the Presidency of our 71 year old Ocala Art Group. She loves the CHALLENGES that this



group is presenting to its members and has picked up Watercolors again to paint for the Classic Movie Shows we have set up. WHAT FUN!!!

How lucky we all are to have our art with us AT ALL TIMES . . . through thick and thin, sad and happy, fast and slow, good and bad times!!! LUCKY US!!!
